This program for individuals and families is designed to determine risk and prioritization when providing assistance to homeless and those at-risk of homelessness.

### Homeless Prevention

A comprehensive, easily accessible service and housing response system that addresses the needs of those who are homeless or at serious risk of homelessness.

### Rapid Re-housing Housing

An intervention program designed to help individuals and families that don't need intensive and ongoing supports to quickly exit homelessness and return to permanent housing. Rapid re-housing assistance is offered without preconditions — like employment, income, absence of criminal record, or sobriety — and the resources and services provided are tailored to the unique needs of the household.

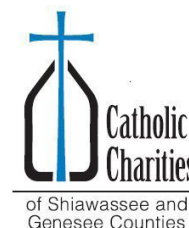

## Prevention and Education

Providing programs and classes to strengthen individuals and families, as well as increase resistance to substance use in youth/families. Programs are provided in schools, churches, or other locations.

### Second Step, Student Assistance Program (SAP), Botvin's Life Skills Training

Three different eight-week programs to build self-esteem, decrease bullying and reduce risky behaviors in school-age youth.



### Substance Use Education Program

Youth and adults learn about drugs; how they affect the body and the effects of drug use on relationships.

### F.A.S.T (Families and Schools Together)

Working with schools and families, targeting

elementary age students experiencing behavior problems. Building positive interactions, relationships and support systems among parents, students and schools. Includes education on the negative effects of alcohol, tobacco and other drug use.

### Parenting Classes S.T.E.P (System Training for Effective Parenting) and Parenting Young Children (Early Childhood S.T.E.P)

Helping parents by building positive relationships and self-esteem in children, incorporating education on safe and effective discipline techniques.

### P.E.A.R.L.S.

### (Program to Encourage Active, Rewarding Lives for Seniors)

Empowering older adults, 50 and older, to take action and make lasting changes for improving quality of life. Topics include: Depression, Healthy Aging & Life Changes, Emotional & Physical Health and Problem Solving. Individuals learn how to re-establish healthy routines, increase positive experiences, and make changes that to lead a more active and rewarding life.
